Guests to the SkyLift Park will have access to the SkyLift, SkyCenter, SkyBridge and SkyDeck, along with an exclusive “sneak-peek” of the SkyTrail boardwalk before it opens to the public.

Spooktacular Smokies is all about the younger goblins and ghouls, with scary stories on the SkyDeck every Friday and Saturday night from September 24 to October 31, with additional activities on Halloween weekend. Enjoy spooky music, scary(ish) stories, and Halloween lights. Any child under 12 who is wearing a costume will be admitted free on Halloween weekend. There will also be candy stations for costumed children to trick or treat throughout Halloween weekend, employees in costume.
